The scheme is well designed and we believe our store will encourage more people to visit and shop in the centre."

A spokesperson from Northern Trust added "We have worked closely with the local community, occupiers at the Centre, local authority and other key stakeholders in bringing forward the plans for the redevelopment of the Carrington Centre, and are pleased to see them finally come to fruition. Having the two Grand National winning

horses on hand to showcase the new parade of shops is a fitting occasion for the centre which has brought significant investment into the area."

The plans at the Carrington Centre also incorporate a housing scheme which is being completed by Bloor Homes and consists of 62 family homes in a range of 3, 4 and 5 bedrooms, a proportion of which are affordable. In addition, as part of the overall plans Northern Trust secured the future of the football pitch on a long term agreement with the Parish Council.
